Dillon Nature Preserve and Cemetery

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the PRAC Committee of the Town of Dillon, Colorado, was held on Monday, July 10, 2023, in person at the Dillon Nature Preserve and Dillon Cemetery. Mimi Motahari called the meeting to order at 5:02 pm. Committee members present were Morgan Courtney, Mimi Motahari, Thomas Kelly, and Louis Skowyra. Staff members present were Jessie Klehfoth, Events and Recreation Director; and Libba Muzi, Recording Secretary.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF JANUARY 9, 2023, REGULAR MEETING

Louis Skowyra moved to approve the minutes from the June 5, 2023, regular meeting. Morgan Courtney seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

The committee met at the Dillon Nature Preserve to have a chance to discuss the history and future of the space, while getting to familiarize themselves with the area.

Scott O'Brien started the meeting by giving a brief history of the Nature Preserve area.

The group discussed the trail system and what is currently available to the public to hike. There are a few trails that are preserved by the Town of Dillon. There has been some renovating in the past to avoid "social" trails being made and to make navigation of the area more straightforward.

The subject then transitioned to future improvements and what could be done for the area. The group focused on parking improvements, potential picnic shelters and turning lanes on Highway 6 to make access safer for users. They also discussed potential improvements of the recreation path to make it safer for hikers.

The second half of the meeting was conducted in the Dillon Cemetery and the Disc Golf recreation area.

The future of Cemetery Road was discussed, along with the potential for a roundabout to be put in in the future to allow for easier navigation of the two areas. This led to the discussion of where the signage would go and how it would flow with the roundabout. The continuation of this discussion was planned to happen in a future meeting.

Scott also discussed the Veterans Memorial proposal that allocates for the veteran's plots to be more clearly marked and honored.

Jessie Klehfoth then met the committee at the disc golf and recreation area parking lot. The discussion shifted to desired improvements of the disc golf area, including the renovation of a few holes due to safety concerns.

The parking lot the committee was standing in was also a huge topic of conversation. The many obviously needed improvements were discussed and there was a consensus that it should be of high priority to maintain the usage of this area.

Jessie mentioned that they have goals of making Dillon a “Disc Golf destination” as so many other towns have become. She believes there is great potential for the Dillon course and continued improvements are necessary.
