Introduction

Colorado wildflowers are world renown. Images of Colorado wildflowers can be found in every world travelers photo feed or bucket list for their unique beauty. These scenes are **also** under snow for many months and as the snow melts the flowers come out in great vigor and beauty. In fact, the snow and the flowers have a very close relationship, as it is winter snow that provides the water for springtime flowers.

Our proposal is to create, in the northern portion of Dillon Town Park, an "Alpine Park," which will be series of wildflower gardens along with trails and picnic areas and grass. We propose creating this space to be beautiful, of dual use, and of greater public benefit than the current use. In winter, the space will be used for Ice Castles. In summer, the same improvements will be available for public use. This will allow the Town to keep a pristine soccer field that is accessible to the public in early spring and turn the now under-used portion of the park into a vibrant and beautiful summer sanctuary.



Core Principles

Dual Use, Public Benefit, Beauty.

Spaces are designed for winter use and summer use. Examples:

- Pavilions are used in summer for picnics and in winter for Ice Castles' ticketing. **Summer image on top, Winter shown below.**
- Trails, some paved and some gravel, wind through the gardens and pavilions in summer and create safe passage into Ice Castles in winter.
- Design facilitates natures pattern of ice melting in the spring, providing water for early summer flowers.
- Utility design provides for events in the summer and Ice Castles in winter.
- Drainage is designed into overall plan.
- Designed to create the most beautiful experience possible.





Summer Gardens

The summer concept includes:

- Flower Gardens planted with plants indigenous to the region that are used to being under snow and ice for several months a year.
- Some of the park will be comprised of grass providing a space for people and animals to enjoy the outdoors when events are on the field.













Benefits to Ice Castles

Ice Castles experiences expands:

- The Ice Castles experience as we know it would stay the same size, approximately 1 acre.
- Ice Caves, made of snow, would cover ¹/₃ of an acre.
- Ice Skating, would also cover ¹/₃ of an acre.
- There would be additional small activities as space permits and to enhance the visitor experience.

The move allows Ice Castles to create more winter activities for families in order to stay relevant and provide new offerings.




Tennis Court is used as skating rink in winter.

Lawn and flower gardens beautify space in Summer


