TOWN OF DILLON PRACC MEETING NOTES

REGULAR MEETING MONDAY, June 5, 2023 5:00 p.m.

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the PRAC Committee of the Town of Dillon, Colorado, was held on Monday, June 5, 2023, in person at Dillon Town Hall. Eric Nichols called the meeting to order at 5:03 pm. Committee members present were Eric Nicholds, Mimi Motahari, Maureen Lopp, Morgan Courtney, Lucinda Burns, and Louis Skowyra. Staff members present were Terese Berger, Recreation Manager; Scott O'Brien, Public Works Director; Renee Imamura, Town Council; and Libba Muzi, Recording Secretary.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF April 3, 2023, REGULAR MEETING

Louis Skowyra moved to approve the minutes from the May 1, 2023, regular meeting. Maureen Lopp seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

The meeting began with Public Works director, Scott O'Brien, presenting the idea that the two projects in discussion regarding the Nature Preserve and Cemetery areas become one project. He suggested that instead of looking at these areas separately, the funds could be allocated to hire a consultant to look at both areas. He noted that there is \$100,000 in the budget for this project that could be used for signage and consultation of the two areas.

Eric Nicholds ensured that the town's materials they already possess would still be used and Scott confirmed that.

Morgan Courtney added that there needs to be a common understanding that whatever signage is chosen does not take away from the significance of the cemetery to maintain respect.

The committee was in favor of this idea and discussed a presentation to council in the near future. Morgan Courtney volunteered to present.

Scott O'Brien then reviewed the Art in the Garden art show that was held by the members of the community garden. Pictures of the art pieces displayed were shown to the committee.

Scott then introduced the idea of a Native Species Garden on the edge of the new Town Park. This garden would feature species native to the area and be maintained by the volunteers of the Community Garden as an opportunity for them to get more involved while simultaneously earning their volunteer hours. The committee was very enthusiastic about the idea.

The committee then went through updates about the Town Park and the amphitheater. Town Park is close to being finished, and the Farmer's Market will be held along side the park throughout the summer.

The amphitheater renovations are going well, with the paving to be finished up by the end of the week.

PUBLIC COMMENT

No public was present for comment.

FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

July 10 meeting will be a tour of the cemetery and nature preserve areas.

The committee also requested a report of the Tenderfoot Meadows event at the County Commons from Recreation Manager, Terese Berger.
